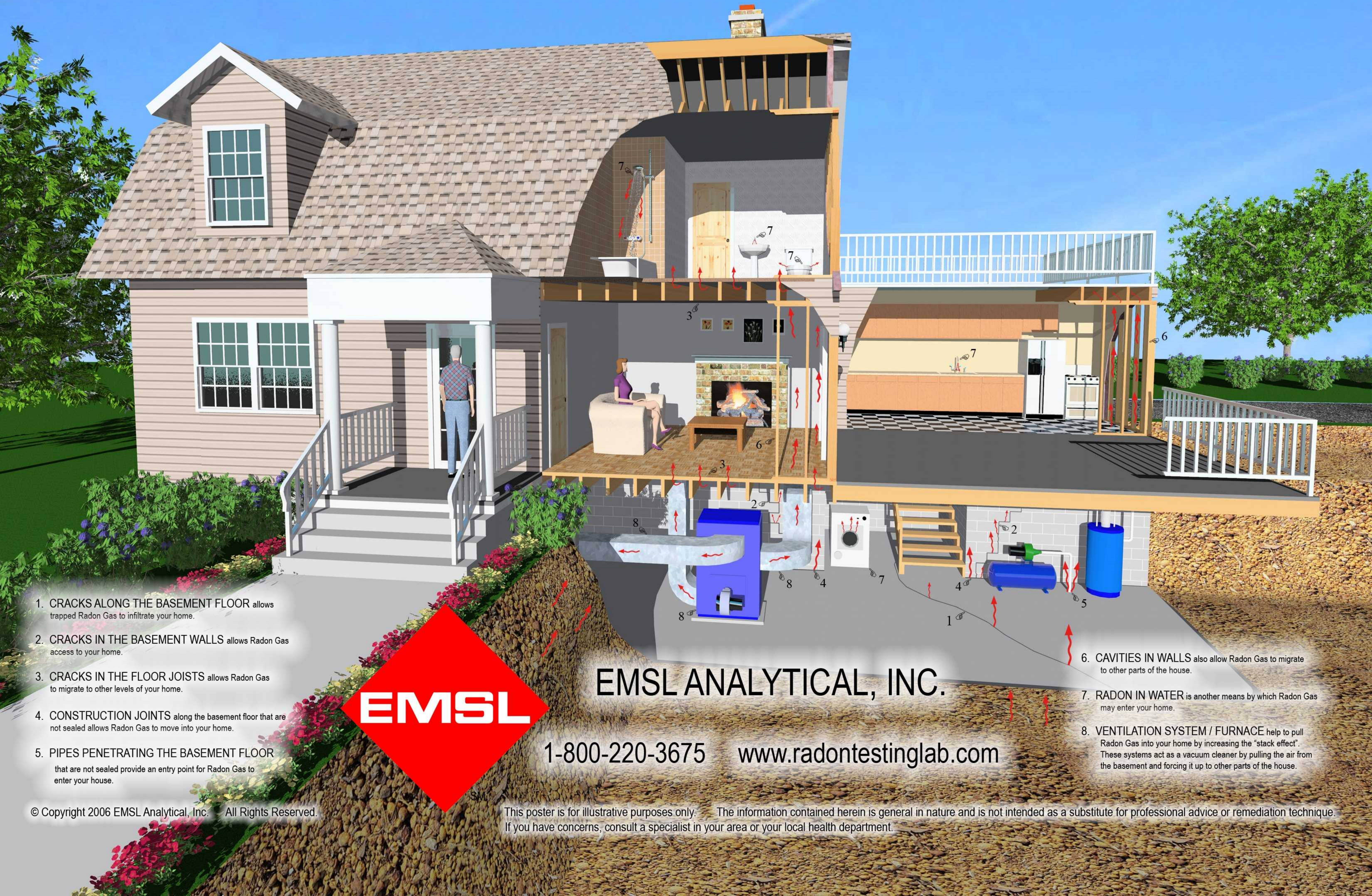


RADON IN HOMES



1. CRACKS ALONG THE BASEMENT FLOOR allows trapped Radon Gas to infiltrate your home.
2. CRACKS IN THE BASEMENT WALLS allows Radon Gas access to your home.
3. CRACKS IN THE FLOOR JOISTS allows Radon Gas to migrate to other levels of your home.
4. CONSTRUCTION JOINTS along the basement floor that are not sealed allows Radon Gas to move into your home.
5. PIPES PENETRATING THE BASEMENT FLOOR that are not sealed provide an entry point for Radon Gas to enter your house.

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6. CAVITIES IN WALLS also allow Radon Gas to migrate to other parts of the house.
7. RADON IN WATER is another means by which Radon Gas may enter your home.
8. VENTILATION SYSTEM / FURNACE help to pull Radon Gas into your home by increasing the "stack effect". These systems act as a vacuum cleaner by pulling the air from the basement and forcing it up to other parts of the house.

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
